Covid -19

- For almost the whole year between April 2020 to March 2021, Face to Face Scouting was very restricted.
- Over the Summer Covid-19 secure procedures were in place and approved by the Executive Committee and District Commissioner.
- As a result, physical meetings could take place in September and October.
- All sections ran meetings on Zoom instead. The leaders rapidly adjusted and provided various activities such as virtual camps or dropped materials off at homes.
- Participation rates varied, with higher participation at the younger age end.

- 3 Cub Packs (Walters, Spence and Chapel Hill)
- 65 Cub Scouts (31 Jan 2021) (-6)
- 15 Chief Scouts Silver awards in year to 31 Jan 21

Activities

- Cabot Home Challenge badges
- Cabot District craft competition
- Christmas cards for local care home residents
- Orienteering at Blaise

Scout Achievements

The Numbers

- 2 Scout Troops (Loach and Bentley)
- 74 Scouts (31 Jan 2021) (+19)
- 2 Chief Scouts Gold awards in year to 31 Jan 21 (small year group)

Activities

- In September ran half group each week to keep within allowed limits and had activities at the Scout field or cooking at Northcote.
- During lockdown delivered materials to homes to support activities such as sunflower seeds and balloons.
- Ran quizzes, badge work such as science, cooking, geocaching and local knowledge

Group Achievements

The Numbers

- 38 Adult Leaders and helpers (-2)
- 13 Young Leaders (-1)

Activities

- Leaders updated their training.
 - Almost 100% compliance with training requirements
 - First Aid Courses could not be run and so currently catching up on the backlog
- Northcote Hall was repainted.
- Outdoor facilities improved at Northcote
 - Permanent: Outside sink, tables and benches
 - Temporary: Lighting and shelters
- Over 1500 Trees planted at the Scout Field

Income

- 2020-21 Income £44k
 - Feed in tariff £5k
 - Hall rental £5k (down £12k)
 - Gift Aid £10k
 - Government Grants £19K

Expenditure

- 2020-21 Expenditure running costs £33k

Notes

- During COVID-19 spend minimised to essential items only.
- Rental income and subscriptions significantly impacted by the building closure. The Government state aid grant of £19k helped bridge the shortfall.
- Sufficient reserves in place remain operational through any uncertain times to come.
